

The Topic: Here and Now



The Goal: Insight and Understanding

The Stapferhaus is a place of dialogue. All are invited to contribute their convictions but also to explore other points of view. The Stapferhaus contrasts the exchange among like-minded people with the experience of the unfamiliar and surprising. Through a change of perspective, our assumptions can be questioned, and our own positions can be reexamined. In this way, our awareness of diversity in our society is sharpened, and democracy is strengthened. The Path: Head and Gut

The Stapferhaus creates worlds that remain in our memory. In collaboration with experts in scenography, architecture, film, games, drama, light, and sound, exhibition spaces are developed that address and involve visitors on various levels. They touch and move, see and feel, read and hear, experience and discuss. In addition to the exhibitions, the building offers space for established and new event formats.

The Place: Play and Transformation

The Stapferhaus is housed in a pioneering new wooden building at the Lenzburg train station that places itself entirely at the service of its content and its visitors. The architecture is designed for change. Walls and stairs can be moved, floors opened, the façade and forecourt playfully altered: a big stage for the examination of the big questions of our time. In addition to the 1400 square meters of exhibition space, the building also has several event spaces and a bistro where visitors can linger. The Stapferhaus also takes its projects beyond the building's walls: in Switzerland, abroad, and on the Internet.



The History: Change and Consistency


The Stapferhaus was founded in 1960 at Lenzburg Castle. Representatives of Pro Helvetia, the canton of Aargau, the city of Lenzburg, the Pro Argovia foundation, and the New Helvetic Society stated its purpose: "The establishment and operation of an Aargau and Swiss site of human encounter and intellectual debate." They deliberately kept the format open: "The design of the task must be worked out from experience."


For the first thirty years, the focus was on conferences and debates; starting in the late 1990s, it was on large thematic exhibitions in temporary-use spaces. In 2018, the Stapferhaus moved into its new building at the Lenzburg train station, uniting exhibition, event, and office spaces under one roof. Today, the goal of all activities in the Stapferhaus is still dialogue – what has changed is the mode of communication. "Every conversation in the Stapferhaus attempts to set something in motion: to break us out of the prison of rigid preoccupation with our own concerns, to move us forward into the reality of community. When we are set in motion in this way, when we begin to have a dialogue even within ourselves, because we were impressed by an unconventional thinker we met in the Stapferhaus, or because we were confronted with aspects of reality we hadn't considered before – this invisible result of the Stapferhaus' work is at the same time its most beautiful, its most genuine. This is what it is designed to do: it aims at fruitful dialogue."
